The presentation should focus on both the *process* and *product* of designing the alternative HCCS website.

It should include:

- A description of the website, including a demonstration of the website in action.
- A description of how the group worked together. This could, for example, include information about the various roles adopted by group members; how the project was managed, how any problems were resolved, or how the group communicated throughout the project.

The presentation should be handled as a group, with responsibilities for different aspects meted out. Every person on the course should speak for a minimum of 5-10 minutes.

Weighting

This contributes towards 30% of the assessed marks for the course. The grade is assigned by the tutor but will be adjusted for individuals by agreement within group.

Group Marking Criteria

Your presentation should be well prepared and well rehearsed beforehand.

You should think about how best to structure your talk in a logical and coherent way. Each member of the group should be given the opportunity to make some key points.

Presentation slides (e.g. powerpoint) should be used to give your presentation. (If this is a problem then come and talk to the tutor.) You should think about how best to use this medium to support your presentation. The group is expected to submit a copy of their slides to the tutor.

You will be marked using the following criteria:

Content Issues:

- Coverage of issues in asked for in presentation
- Critical reflection of design process
- Quality of design ideas
- Quality of website demonstration

Presentation Issues:

- Clarity of visual powerpoint presentation (and design of information on slides)
- Clarity of verbal presentation
- Engagement with audience
- Timing
- Group coordination of work

Individual Marking Criteria

When considering how to peer assess your teammates you should consider the following criteria:

- Contribution to organisation of project
- Contribution to design ideas
- Contribution to construction of website/preparation of materials
- Contribution to preparation of presentation
- Willingness to engage in discussion
- Willingness to listen to others' ideas
- Overall quality of experience of working with that person

An individual's mark will be determined by agreement of adjustment within the group.
