Can support students with:	 Personal concerns affecting study progress or well-being. Funding and finance including scholarships, bursaries and hardship funds. Sources of help to improve academic performance – identifying obstacles to learning. Understanding university systems and regulations in relation to assessment, services, complaints, conduct, and discipline. Progression, intermission and withdrawal processes - discussion and support. Referrals to other professional services on campus. Exceptional circumstances help
A proactive service: may co	ontact students in response to concern from School about attendance, participation or engagement with course.
Can provide information on how to submit claim. Student Life Advisor appointments provide space to discuss circumstances and identify any additional support needs student may have.	 EC (Exceptional Circumstances claims) can be submitted as a result of the following assessment situations: Late or non-submission of assessment. Absence from an in-person assessment (examination or test). Assessment submitted on time and/or in-person assessment (examination) taken on scheduled date where the assessment performance is seriously and unexpectedly impaired. Forthcoming absence from in-person assessment and exceptionally an anticipated non-submission or claim for late submission where evidence is compelling. All claims and supporting evidence must be submitted online via Sussex Direct and be supported by robust evidence which corresponds to the assessment deadlines or scheduled examination. Claims should be submitted within 7 days of the first assessment deadline and the evidence should be submitted within 21 days of the first assessment deadline. Evidence which is submitted late should be sent to mec.chair@sussex.ac.uk.
