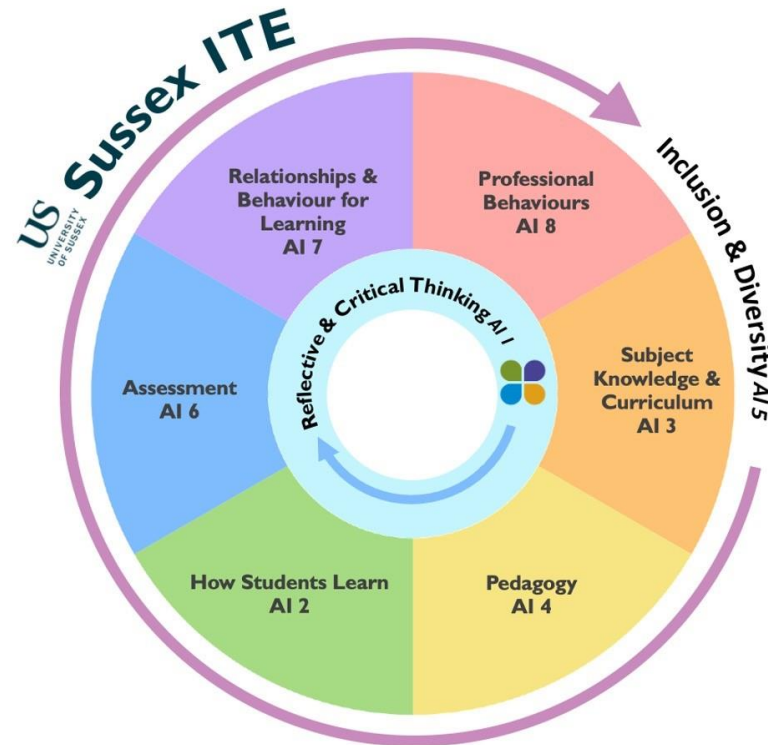


Secondary ITE Professional Studies Curriculum 2023/24
