FLEXIBILITY AND CHOICE

Sussex geography students focus on the key global issues of our times, such as climate change and international migration, and choose from options covering much more – like social and spatial inequality and difference, geomorphology, environmental hazards, colonial networks, rebellion and resistance. The choice of modules and degree combinations reflects our diversity and faculty research expertise, and is flexible enough to allow you to develop your own interests and build a unique degree, mixing human and physical geography options as you wish.

Geography is one of the most diverse and interdisciplinary degrees you could choose to study, making geographers highly employable across a wide range of careers. Geography also gives you 'cultural agility' – a characteristic regarded by multinational employers as the most desirable graduate skill (*Global Graduates into Global Leaders, 2011*). This skill is a core part of our teaching, further developed by our international fieldwork and study abroad opportunities.

WORLD LEADING REPUTATION

Come to Sussex to study geography and join a welcoming, lively and successful department which received exemplary National Student Survey scores for overall satisfaction in both 2018 and 2019 and is currently ranked 8th in the UK (Guardian league tables 2019). You'll be taught by research-active lecturers who are passionate about their subjects. Our research came 1st nationally for the outstanding reach and significance of its impacts (REF 2014). We have a fantastic staff to student ratio and a unique international outlook with study, career and research opportunities around the world. The University of Sussex provides the perfect location to study geography, situated within the beautiful South Downs National Park, close to the south coast and the vibrant city of Brighton, just an hour from London.

HONOURS DEGREES

You can choose BA Geography to study the relationship between human societies and their environments or BSc Geography to explore environmental and physical geography, climate and landscape change.

Our single honours degrees allow you to focus on the study of geography whilst taking modules from other subjects to provide a wider context including international development, languages or ecology and conservation. STUDY OR WORK ABROAD


Many of our students are keen to develop a truly global approach to their studies, something that is reflected in the range of study opportunities available to them. You can spend a term or a whole year studying geography in English at one of more than 140 overseas partner universities around the world. You can also undertake a professional placement abroad or in the UK. Investing time in the workplace will add to your skills and confidence and is a great opportunity to try out career options.



After your degree

According to recent data 98% of our students were in work or further study 6 months after graduating (Destinations of Leavers from Higher Education Survey 2017). Our graduates find careers in a diverse range of fields, from environmental management to social media. Their analytic, numeric and organisational skills enable them to undertake a wide range of roles including: environmental journalist, geomorphologist with the Environment Agency, programme manager with BBC Worldwide, geoinformation analyst with Shell Netherlands, managing a solar energy company, safe house manager with a charity for trafficked people and Countryside Officer with a county council.
