Biodiversity

Sublittoral Survey Workshop

The biodiversity team held a sublittoral monitoring transnational workshop in Dieppe on Thursday 26th October. The workshop was well attended with representatives of local dive clubs, local researchers (one working on marine aggregate extraction) and staff from the Cité de la Mer. The presentations on UK sublittoral survey, primarily Seasearch, were very well received and the French participants were interested in being kept informed. One of the divers showed a video of local dives and provided us with a copy from which we should be able to extract valuable data. We were also shown some

footage of the seabed following aggregate extraction which could also be a valuable source of data. Our grateful thanks go to M. Eric Tavernier, Président of ESTRAN Cité de la Mer, and his staff who very kindly hosted the workshop.
