### **Phase II Final Transnational Conference:**

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> & Friday 19<sup>th</sup> January 2007 in Le Touquet, hosted by the Université du Littoral. The meeting was opened by Councillor Roger Thomas, ESCC, Vice-Chair of the UK Local Government Area Coastal Issues Special Interest Group. More than 40 participants enjoyed the 22 presentations and posters (programme). The meeting provided an overview of progress made by all partners and the opportunity to discuss plans for Phase III. Work on the special volume of the scientific journal Zeitschrift für Geomorphologie is already underway at the University of Sussex and the Université du Littoral, ESCC will be working on a new leaflet and the GIS based toolbox for coastal managers will be created largely by the Université du Littoral.
