This was particularly useful for the ships anchored in The Downs, the stretch of water between Deal and the Goodwin Sands. It was here that vessels waited for a favourable wind to take them into the Thames, and was a gathering point for merchantmen waiting for naval escorts during the Napoleonic Wars.
