Collaborative learning and academic integrity

- Faculty will invite and meet with academic advisees at least once a term; please attend the meetings and be in touch with your **academic advisor** if you require additional support.

Communication and netiquette

- Check your **university email address** at least once a day. We expect you to read and act upon the emails we send to you, and you can expect the same from us.
- When emailing, **always include an appropriate salutation** (e.g. 'Dear') and address the person by name, unless they have indicated another preference (e.g. their title). This is part of the school's commitment to racial, gender and all other forms of equality.
- Always try to **find the information** you are seeking in documents/websites before emailing a member of staff. Staff will not prioritise responding to enquiries where the answers are readily available on Canvas.
- If you are in a zoom teaching session, please keep your mics muted until you have been 'given the floor' and your video on to enhance engagement during these sessions. If your bandwidth makes keeping video on difficult during live sessions, please upload a picture or avatar of yourself and try turning the video on when you contribute to discussions.
- The online classroom presents additional privacy and safety risks **please be conscious of these and be proactive about maintaining a respectful environment.**
- Any electronic material provided to you as a part of your study is **not to be shared or published**, in whole or in part, anywhere.
