This lecture theatre is accessible through the double doors by the seating area, opposite the main entrance.

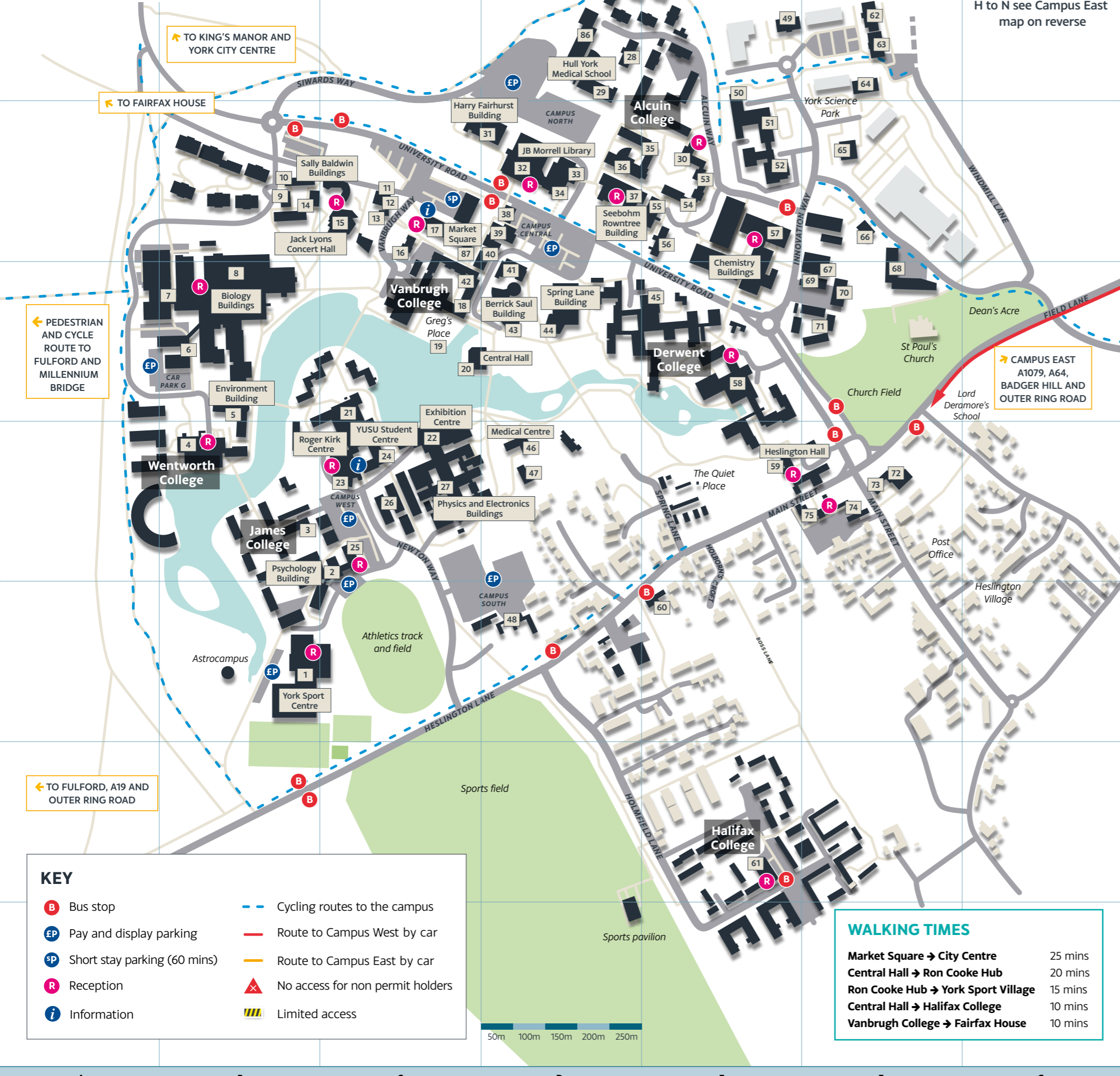
