### Grade 7

### Summary

Roles at this level will represent proficiency in the early stages of an academic career before progression to Grade 8, or a clearly defined set of responsibilities within a research project or education provision, e.g. for part of a research project or education programme. There may be a combination of research and education, or a specific focus on research or education alongside related administrative responsibilities. In addition, role holders may be required to assist in the supervision of students. Support in the form of appropriate mentoring will normally be provided and those in education or research and education roles given the opportunity to undertake at least the first stage in the Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education.
