Whether you're just at the start of your Sussex adventure, or a late-stage researcher thinking about post-PhD life, our Researcher Development Programme is designed to enhance your skills, helping you to succeed in your doctorate and future career. We aim to complement the support provided within your School and offer relevant and practical development opportunities, whatever your discipline. Our programme provides year-round training opportunities, coordinated around the four following areas:

- Managing your research
- Library and academic skills
- Writing and communication
- Career development

All training sessions are delivered by professional services, research and academic staff, and are open to doctoral researchers from any discipline. Sessions come in a range of formats, including short information-focused sessions, longer workshops, and online opportunities such as webinars.

Before booking onto any activity, you should meet with your supervisor to discuss your training and development needs, and identify ways of meeting them through our programme. This resource sets out the knowledge and skills required to be an effective researcher.

The Sussex Fund Doctoral Overseas Conference Grant supports doctoral researchers who are presenting their work at an overseas conference. You can apply for up to ± 1000 during the period of their registration.
