

Alexandros Daniilidis - Coffees, Cocoa, Teas "Mekka"

In the food market's historical arcades, among mesmerising smells, traders' voices, barters and everyday trade 'rituals', anold coffee roaster stands there for nearly a century now. It opened back in 1925 when Modiano Food Arcade was first built in Thessaloniki's center. Ever since, the knowledge and passion for good quality coffee has been passing down from generation to generation, thus rendering the art of coffee roasting and coffee trade a 'heirloom', the legacy of Notaras family. The highly identifiable smell of freshly grounded coffee dominates the smellscape of the market while the story of the shop and, by extension of the whole market, is reflected on the old, traditional grinding machinery, the photos on the wall and the memories of the owner's 'devoted' clientele. This thesis is exploring the intersection and interaction of materiality with memory and everyday market culture within Thessaloniki's traditional commercial district



Avanka Fernando - Darkness and Light "Development"

The national flag flies high at Crystal Court, 4th February 2019, Independence Day, Sri Lanka. The flag was placed by youth in Crystal Court, a government owned, high rise housing project. Crystal Court symbolises urban development projects in Colombo. A transformation from 'slums' to a 'palace' is promised to those involuntarily relocated from 'prime land' in the city. For my ethnographic study, I lived in the 15th floor of Crystal Court exploring everyday lived realities of the urban poor in Colombo. Their life-worlds were characterised by sorrow and joy, crises and celebrations, conflict and solidarity, entrapment and freedom, the crystal meth trade, debt and encounters with authorities. This image captures darkness and light within urban development and its impact on the urban poor. Although development is juxtaposed with lofty ideals of freedom depicted in the unfurled national flag, this is seldom seen in Crystal Court."




Swati Bhargava - Sustainability in Cities: The Holy Cow in an Oblivion

This picture includes 4 seasons: spring, summer, autumn, winter at the same place. This 4 seasonscaptured during my PhD research about "light intensity with human vision receptor" at Wimbledon common (London) from May 2019 until March 2021. We generally think that sun changes position in galaxy as the result of changing of earth temperatures. However, in visual neuroscience, we believe that the properties of natural visual images altered by light intensity. And it is important to understand them as they describe the properties of natural scenes that ultimately set the parameters of visual processing. For my PhD, I recorded the distribution of light intensity and colour changes in natural images using photographic and spectroscopic method. This beautiful pictures prefect reflected the changes of light intensity and also my work through 2 years "light collection" at Wimbledon common.
