
1.0 Overview

The menu option Exams: Candidate Details gives the ability to search for a student and look up the formal assessments for which they have been entered. There is a screen listing all the courses the student has taken along with credit and net marks for each course, and a screen showing the detailed breakdown of marks for each course with its component assessments.




2.0 Candidate Details

To search for a candidate enter a Surname and an initial or forename, or a Candidate Number, or a Registration Number or a Person Code. Select the candidate in the list that is returned.





3.0 View Assess



This screen shows basic details about the candidate across the top of the screen. The candidate's level, current year, department and programme title are shown beneath the candidate name.

The course assessments block contains a drop down list that allows you to filter the years of study shown on the screen allowing a clearer view if you are only interested in the assessments for one year of study.

The fields in the main list are as follows:

Stu Yr	The year of the programme that the course assessment belongs to
Year	The academic year in which the course assessment was taken

Course The course code
Title The name of the course

Mode(s) The modes of assessment used for the course Credits The number of credits ascribed to the course

Net Mark The overall mark for the course with all penalties applied

Circumstance Contains codes giving information about absences, non-submissions, resits etc. A full list

of these codes is given in the appendix

Evidence This field contains an E if the student has submitted mitigating evidence


Total Credits This shows the total credits for the courses currently displayed on the screen. Usually

an undergraduate student will take courses that total 120 credits per year



4.0 Course Details

If you click on the blue course code on the course assessments screen you will see further details for the course:



This screen has 3 blocks:

Course Assessment Mark contains details of the course and its marks at the highest level. The overall mark for the course is shown as Net Mark in this block. If the course only has one mode of assessment and it is not CWK then only this block will contain information. If the only mode of assessment on the course is CWK this block and the Coursework Marks block will be populated.

If there is more than one mode of assessment for the course the marks for assessment modes that contribute to the overall mark (called sub assessments) are detailed in the **Sub Assessment Marks** block.

If the course is assessed by coursework the details of coursework assessments are shown in the **Coursework Marks** block



Course Assessment Mark

Contains the details of the course, its assessment and the overall mark for the course. If a course only has one mode of assessment the Sub Assessment Marks and Coursework Marks blocks will be empty.

Stu Yr The year of programme that the student was on when they took this course

Year The academic year in which this course was taken by this student

Course The course code Title The course title

Mode(s) The mode(s) of assessment used for this instance of this course
Net Mark The overall mark for this course after all penalties have been applied

Circumstance Contains codes giving information about absences, non-submissions, resits etc. A full list

of these codes is given in the appendix

Evidence This field contains an E if the student has submitted mitigating evidence

Type Contains M for Major, S for School, O for Other, Y for Year abroad, PG for postgraduate Circumstance Detail Contains circumstance codes for sub assessments – the codes are preceded by the

mode of assessment e.g. ESS:NS for non submitted Essay. A full list of these codes is

given in the appendix

Mark This is the mark before any penalties are applied at this level. If the course only has one

mode of assessment any relevant penalties will be applied at this level. If there are any sub-assessments penalties will have already been applied as part of the conflation

process

Penalty Shows the value of any penalty applied at this level.

Resit If the assessment is a resit this shows the actual mark achieved at resit. The mark used

for classification is shown in the Net Mark field

accepted and the mark can be used it is moved to Mark.

Alert Shows codes that give information about the status of the mark:

C - This mark has been conflated

K – Used by Undergraduate Office when zero marks are set aside

N - No warning

Y – There is a problem with the mark

Contains the details of the all the sub assessments for the course.

Evidence This field contains an E if the student has submitted mitigating evidence

V Late Mark If the course has sub assessment and a piece of work has been submitted more than 24

hours late and there is a mark it will be stored here (except for CWK). If mitigating

evidence is accepted and the mark can be used it is moved to Mark.

Alert Shows codes that give information about the status of the mark:

C - This mark has been conflated

K – Used by Undergraduate office when zero marks are set aside


N – No warning

Coursework Marks

This block contains the details of all the formal coursework assessments



The fields are

Assessment Details Mode and timing of assessment

Weight The weight the assessment contributes to the coursework mark

Mark The raw mark for this assessment

Penalty The amount of penalty that will be/has been applied to the mark during conflation

Circumstance Contains codes giving information about absences, non-submissions, resits etc. A full list

of these codes is given in the appendix

Evidence This field contains an E if the student has submitted mitigating evidence

Conflation Rule Shows how the coursework assessments are conflated.
