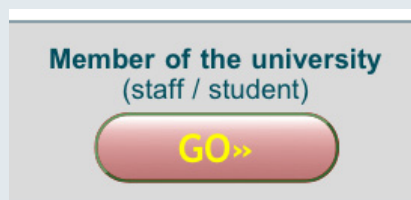


## Connecting to wi-fi with a Nexus 7

Before you start:

- Make sure you know your IT **username** and **password** (confirmed when you registered)
- On your device, go to **Settings** and then **Wi-Fi** and connect to the setup network (**sussex.ac.uk-wifi-setup**)

- 1 Open a web browser and you should see a Sussex web page. Tap the **GO** button for students (or go to <https://www.sussex.ac.uk/roaming> if you don't see this page).



- 2 Login with your username and password (and accept the terms and conditions for the University network the first time you login)

- 3 Tap on the button to **Register a computer**



- 4 Complete the details for your device and tap **register**

- 5 Tap **Register** again to log your computer's unique address.

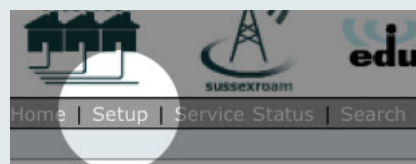

- 6 Once your device's address has been registered, you have to put in the right settings so your Nexus 7 knows how to connect. This is done automatically using a special program called **XpressConnect**.

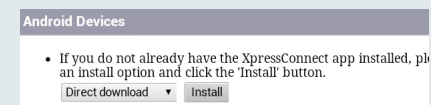
- 7 Tap on the **Setup** link at the top of the page



- 8 Tap the red button to install and run XpressConnect internet access.



- 9 Choose **Direct download** from the drop-down list and click on **install**

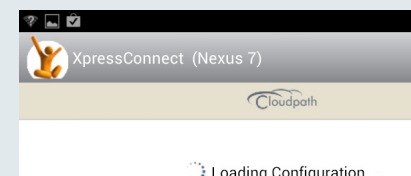


When the XpressConnect app has downloaded, tap on it to Install but don't open it yet.

- 10 Go back to the browser and tap on the link to **run through the configuration of your Android device**



- 11 This will launch the XpressConnect app and start the configuration



- 12 Enter your IT username (followed by @sussex.ac.uk) and password when prompted

When the process has finished, you will be connected to eduroam. You can also try opening a browser and connecting to an external site such as [www.google.com](http://www.google.com) to make sure you're on the web.



Make sure you're protected from viruses by installing software updates.



You should only have to follow this process the first time you connect to eduroam. After that, your device should connect whenever it is in range, as long as the wi-fi is turned on.
