

Visiting Brighton & Hove

This free map is part of a wayfinding scheme for Brighton & Hove that includes maps and wayfinding signs in the street, and downloadable maps from www.visitbrighton.com

Walking

The best way to get around the city is on foot. Use the on-street wayfinding signs to help you find your way around, or why not take the four-mile Healthwalk along the seafront, from Brighton Marina to Hove Lagoon, which has information boards every half mile along the way.

Rail & Coach

Brighton & Hove is just an hour away from London and served by frequent trains from both Southern and First Capital Connect. The city is also well served by coach with National Express.

Taxi

There are plenty of taxis and taxi ranks across the city. In Brighton city centre the main ranks are in East Street, Queen's Square and outside Brighton Station. In Hove, the main ranks are situated outside Hove Town Hall and Hove Station.

You can buy all rail, coach and local bus tickets plus get information on timetables and routes from the Visitor Information Centre next to the Royal Pavilion.

Cycling

If you want to get around by bike, the city is part of the National Cycle Network with an official cycle route along the seafront, along with a number of other cycle routes and lanes around the city. A cycling network map is available from the Visitor Information Centre.

Bus

Brighton & Hove Buses cover all areas of the city centre and beyond. CitySAVER tickets offer unlimited travel on virtually all bus services in the city. If you wish to combine both train and bus travel, just ask for a 'Plusbus' ticket when buying your train ticket. For those who wish to explore the South Downs a 'Downloader' area ticket is a great option.

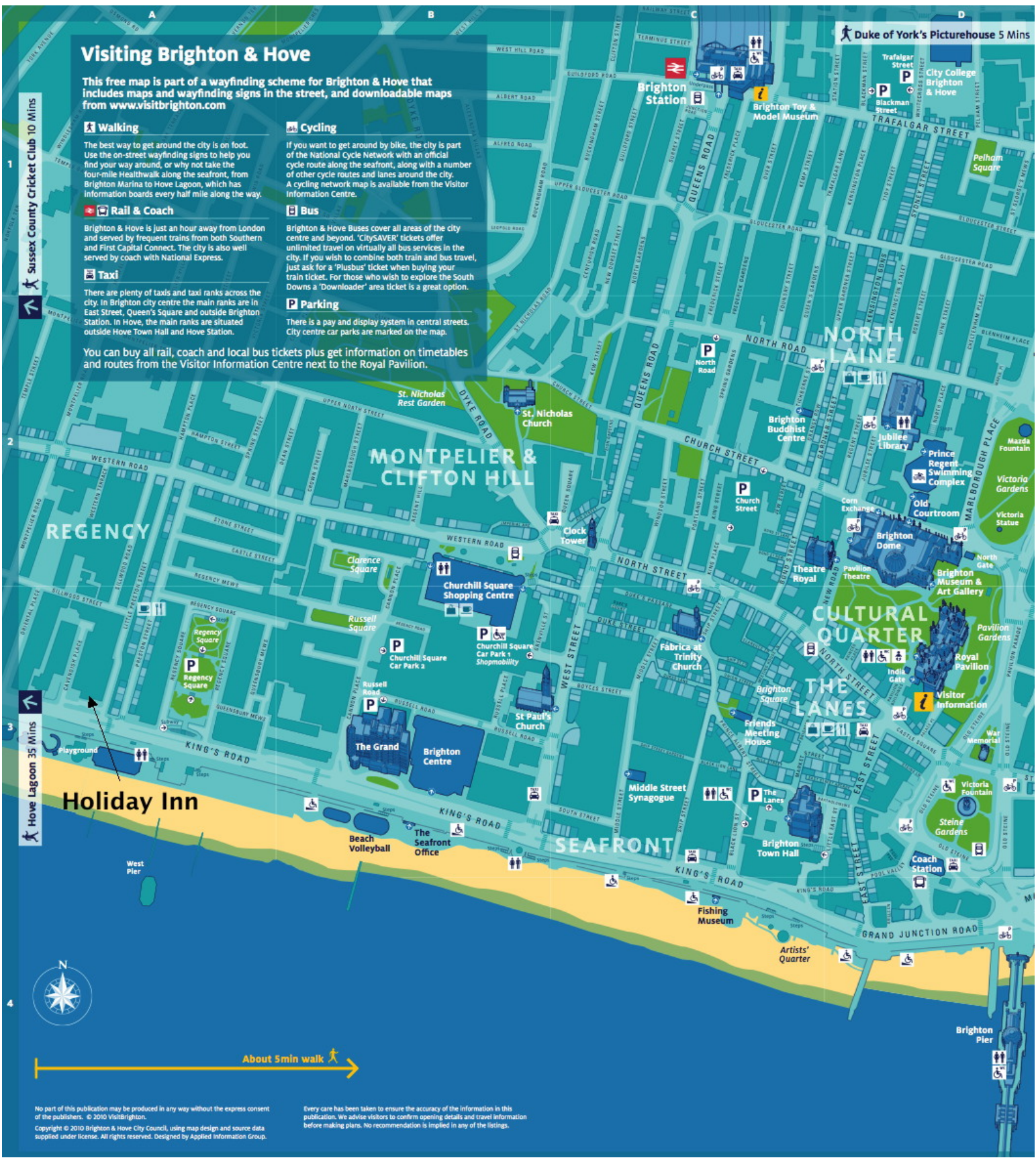
Parking
