



## 21<sup>ST</sup> ANNUAL SPRU DPHIL DAY

 $5^{\text{TH}}$  AND  $6^{\text{TH}}$  OF MAY 2015

The Science Policy Research Unit (SPRU) at the University of Sussex is proud to host the 21 st Annual SPRU DPhil Day. DPhil Day is a free conference spanning two full days that will be of interest to PhD students working in science, technology, and innovation studies, or related fields.

DSkills Day is the first of the two; held on the 5<sup>th</sup> of May. The day will consist of a series of presentations and discussions designed to provide stimulating and practical guidance on conducting research, and will include contributions from leading scholars from SPRU and beyond. Sessions will cover every phase of conducting research – from the early stages of research design, through to implementation and analysis, and ending with a discussion on impact and influence – with a specific focus on dealing with various aspects of *uncertainty* that might arise during each of these phases.

A conference dinner will take place on the evening of the 5<sup>th</sup>, to which all conference delegates and guests are invited.

DPhil Day itself is the second day and will be held on the 6<sup>th</sup> of May. This is an opportunity for PhD students of all stages to present their research in an engaging, friendly, and professional environment, and to gain critical insights and thoughts on their work from peers and prominent scholars alike.

The DPhil Day team welcomes the submission of abstracts from the broad science, technology, and innovation field, possibly including research on the following indicative themes:

- Economics of Innovation and Industrial Policy
- Technology and Innovation Management
- Science, Politics and Decision making
- Energy, Sustainability and Development
- Food, Energy, Health, and Human Security
