

The Socio-Economic categories used are defined by the Government Census Office and collected by UCAS by student self-declaration, based on the occupation of the principal wage-earner of the family, unless the student is mature (over 21 on entry). The categorisations for the first two cohorts monitored in this way were amended in October 2002, and are not directly compatible with current categorisations. This breakdown uses data from October 2002 onwards. From 2004-5 this data is limited to UK Domiciled Undergraduates only and includes data from the BSMS 2004 entry cohort.
