# Opportunity: Researcher Links Travel Grants

Could your research benefit from some time at an overseas institution? Researcher Links Travel Grants provide financial support for early-career researchers to undertake an international research placement to strengthen links for future collaboration, build research capacity in developing economies, and enhance your career opportunities. The next call for travel grant proposals will <u>launch</u> at the end of July under Researcher Links and the Newton Fund.

Researchers that reside in the UK can apply for funding to spend up to 3 months at a university or research institution in one of the partner countries, The countries involved in the 2014 call for proposals will be announced with the call. Different countries have different priority areas which will be announced with the call.

The University has issued a statement demonstrating its commitment to the <u>UK Concordat to Support Research Integrity</u>. The Concordat outlines what is expected of researchers and their employers to ensure the highest standards in research activity.

The <u>University of Sussex Research Integrity Statement</u> sets out the University's principles relating to research governance, ethics and integrity. The statement aims to provide assurances to researchers, funders, the public and other stakeholders as to the University's commitment to engage in research activity that is properly conducted to the highest standards.
