



Under one roof

UK Research and Innovation incorporates research councils that provide grants in six areas and one that supports science facilities, as well as an innovation agency. Half the overall budget, shown for 2017–18, is spent on block grants to universities, through Research England.

How to apply



March 2018 sector competition: Open

- UK businesses can apply for a share of £19 million for game-changing innovations with strong commercial potential that will significantly impact the UK economy.
- Eligibility:
- To lead a project you must:
- be a UK based business of any size
- carry out your project in the UK
- work alone or in collaboration with others (businesses, research base or third sector)
- Open now
- Closes:
- 9 May 2018

Open Programme Round 1 – opens May 10th, max of 3 applications per applicant

Innovation Loans

- Loans to enable the increase in manufacturing readiness of innovations in manufacturing systems or processes and/or materials development, integration or reuse.
- Eligibility: to take on an innovation loan for a project you must:
- be a UK based micro, small or medium-sized enterprise (SME)
- carry out your project in the UK
- 3.7%, £100K to £1million, over 10 yrs (drawdown, extension, repayment)





Eligibility:

- To submit an expression of interest you must be an industry-led consortium of partners.
- Consortium members can be from academic organisations, public sector bodies, and research and technology organisations (RTOs).
- Closed:18 April 2018
- Decisions on Deep Dive process underway
