## TEL Digital Practice Award Winners!

The TEL Digital Practice Award gives Sussex teaching staff the opportunity to develop or experiment with new tools, resources or teaching approaches with the potential to inform practice in their School or disciplinary area. These are the winners:

The new Centre for Pharmacy has invested in a life-size, computerised human patient simulator called the SimMan 3G. The aim of the pharmacy project is to design case-based scenarios for SimMan 3G use, using Articulate Storyline 2 software and lecture capture, to create e-learning packages and online assessments to facilitate student learning.

Dr Tanja Staehler's project will attempt to counteract a low National Student Survey result in presenting ideas with confidence by creating a series of interactive educational films on Public Speaking and Presentation Skills for students.

Dr Denise Turner's project will utilise creative digital methods to explore the ethical complexities of professional practice within an expanding digital landscape.

Dr Sabita Menon's project will create a video-based e-learning resource, using Camtasia software, that will help lay the groundwork before students are offered face-to-face Interprofessional Education sessions.

### livescribe pens now available at TEL

A Livescribe pen uses a camera and a microphone to record what is written and synchronizes the notes with any audio. It creates what is called a 'pen cast'.

The recordings are then stored on the pen and can be imported to Study Direct as a playable pdf file.

## Academic Integrity

At the start of this academic year, the Academic Development and Quality Enhancement Office integrated the University of Sussex Academic Integrity values of honesty, trust, fairness, respect and responsibility into the examination and assessment regulations.

To promote these values to students and to explain how they are linked to good academic practice, a series of videos have been produced. These are available through the Academic Integrity Study Direct site. 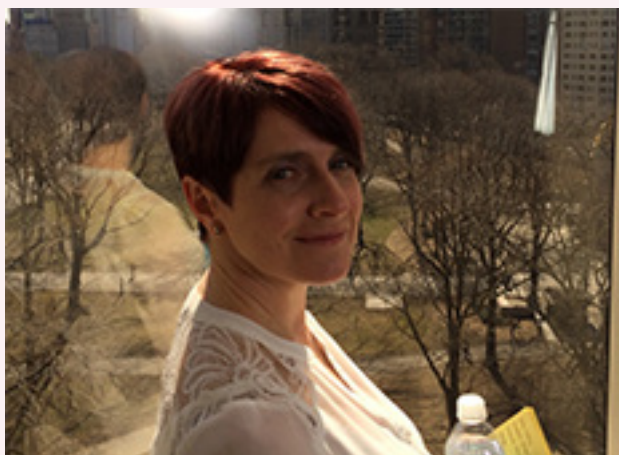

Sharon Flynn is the Assistant Director at the Centre for Excellence in Learning and Teaching (CELT) at the National University of Ireland, Galway. With a background as an academic in computing science, she has a particular interest in technologies for teaching and learning and leads the Learning Technologies Team at NUI Galway. Sharon also co-ordinates a module on Learning Technologies on the university's PG Diploma in Academic Practice.

In keeping with the "One World" theme, this talk will focus on the university campus as one world with various distinct cultural groups. Does the use of technology on campus help to bridge divides or does it reinforce boundaries? Where campus culture is a barrier to adopting technologies for teaching and learning, is there any evidence such cultures can change? Sharon will share examples of projects and initiatives from her own experience and research to explore aspects of these questions.

Sue Beckingham is a Senior Lecturer in Computing and Educational Developer, taking a Faculty lead for Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) at Sheffield Hallam University. She is a Fellow of the Higher Education Academy (HEA) and also a Fellow of the Staff and Educational Development Association (SEDA), where she is a member of the Executive Board. Sue is also a course designer and facilitator of the cross institution open online course 'Bring Your Own Device for Learning' and co-lead of the weekly #LTChat.

Sue will be joining us on the 27th of April to discuss the role of social media for sharing and exchange of knowledge; and the importance today of having a scholarly professional online presence.
