We are seeking applications from a highly motivated post-doctoral research scientist to join an exciting 2.5-year research project on an Economic and Social Research Council grant examining the cognitive mechanisms that explain the relationship between sleep disturbance and depression symptoms in teenagers.

The project will deliver a feasibility, pilot randomised controlled trial, of CBT-informed sleep workshops in secondary schools, and will measure outcomes for depression and sleep, as well as examining cognitive pathways to change.

The grant is led by <u>Dr Faith Orchard</u> and the work will take place at the University of Sussex and West Sussex secondary schools. The post-holder will liaise with other members of the research team, namely Dr Maria Loades (University of Bath) and the <u>West Sussex Mental</u> <u>Health Support Team in Schools</u>

- The post-holder will support Dr Orchard in the day-to-day running of the project, primarily holding responsibility for coordination of young people and parent lived experience advisory groups, co-production of research materials, participant recruitment and data collection (including actigraphy).
- The post-holder will support all other stages of the research process including ethical approvals and pre-registration of studies, through to supporting quantitative and qualitative analyses, and preparation of research papers and presentations.
- The post would be of interest to someone wishing to conduct research in the field of applied youth mental health research. The post-holder would need to have excellent project management skills (e.g. coordinating a research project, organising events), be able to engage and communicate clearly with a young audience, and be able to work independently.

Role description:	Research Fellow I is an early career-grade research position. Post-holders will be expected to contribute to the work of the research team, and also to develop their research skills with support from more experienced members of staff.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES

- 1. To engage in individual and/or collaborative research activity resulting in high-quality publications; and to develop research funding and knowledge exchange income individually or in collaboration with others, as appropriate, depending on the size and scope of the bid.
- 2. To contribute to School teaching activities.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Research, Scholarship & Enterprise

- 1.1 Develop research objectives and proposals for own or joint research, at acceptable levels, with assistance if required.
- 1.2 Conduct research projects individually and in collaboration with others.
- 1.3 Analyse and interpret research findings and draw conclusions on the outcomes.
- 1.4 Produce high-quality research outputs for publication in monographs or recognised high-quality journals, or performance/exhibition, as appropriate, and contribute to the School's REF submission at acceptable levels of volume and academic excellence.
- 1.5 Contribute to the preparation of proposals and applications to external bodies, for example for funding purposes.
- 1.6 Individually or with colleagues, explore opportunities for enterprise activity, knowledge exchange income and/or consultancy, where permissible.
- 1.7 Build internal contacts and participate in internal networks and relevant external networks in order to form relationships and collaborations.

- 4.4 Carry out quantitative longitudinal analyses of self-report measures and actigraphy, and analyses of qualitative interview data.
- 4.5 Attend and present research outputs at, for example, team meetings, seminars, and conferences.
- 4.6 Prepare manuscripts for publication of the project findings and theoretical reviews in international peer-reviewed journals.
- 4.7 Engage with national and international media to disseminate project findings to the general public.
- 4.8 Undertake training and skill development activities to enhance research skills (as needed).
- 4.9 Carry out any other duties commensurate with the grade and purpose of the post

INDICATIVE PERFORMANCE CRITERIA

- A PhD or equivalent scholarly or relevant professional activity
- Pursuing a line of independent research within a research group.
- Publishing research (either from a recently completed PhD or new original research).
- Other forms of externally recognised professional practice of creative output of a standing equivalent to regular publication of original research.
