PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES

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- To provide academic excellence in the design and delivery of high-quality teaching programmes.
- To engage in high-quality research activity resulting in high-quality publications to be submitted to the REF at acceptable levels of volume and academic excellence; to lead research projects or research initiatives in the School; to secure research funding and third-stream income; and to contribute to the School's research strategy.
- To support the management activities of the School and University, and undertake a key role in School or University working groups or committees, as required.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Teaching & Student Support

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- Lead the innovative design, development and delivery of a range of programmes of study at various levels.
- Ensure that course design and delivery comply with the University quality standard and regulations, and take responsibility for the quality of programme units.
- Regularly review and update course content and teaching materials, ensuring that
 they remain up-to-date and relevant, incorporating advances in the subject area and
 utilising appropriate technology.
