Job Description for the post of University Chaplain and Lead Faith Advisor

Division:	Student Experience
Service Area; Location	Wellbeing, Therapeutic and Residential Life Services Meeting House
Grade	8
Responsible to	Head of Wellbeing, Therapeutic and Residential Life Services
Responsible for	A team of Chaplains working a variety of hours and drawn from a range of faith groups

Purpose of the post:

- To lead the Chaplaincy Team in providing a credible faith perspective relating to life and values without imposing particular beliefs on others.
- To provide a focus for the spiritual life of the University community.
- To work closely with faith groups and individuals of faith to help to foster mutual understanding and respect.
- To contribute to the Student Services Management Team.
- To provide opportunity for worship, reflection and prayer.

Key Responsibilities:

- 1 To lead and co-ordinate a team of Chaplains/Faith Advisors drawn from a range of faiths, working with them to develop a model of successful shared ministry
- 2 To develop an initiative, to be agreed with the, Head of Wellbeing, Therapeutic and Residential Life Services, to model inter-faith partnership within the University based on the ethos of social justice
- 3 To engage with established faith groups and societies within the University to

promote mutual understanding, tolerance and respect

- 4 To create opportunities to develop people's understanding of faith
- 5 To form part of the team to be called on to provide 'out of hours' support in the event of a major incident and to work with the team of staff, as required, following the death of a student or member of staff, liaising over any memorial held in the University
- 6 To make contact with students and staff, as appropriate, who are in hospital; recovering from illness; or following a bereavement
- 7. To establish and deliver supportive groups in line with the needs of the service identifying gaps and mechanisms that can be appropriately be addressed using group workshops
- 8. Work closely with colleagues across the division to understand the key pressures, and student concerns throughout the academic year examining ways in which faith and activities of the meeting house can serve to support students at different times
- 9 To ensure policies and procedures are in place for the effective operation of the Meeting House, including policies relating to lone working and use of the Meeting House by other groups.
- 10 To be responsible for the effective management of the Chaplaincy budget, allocating funds and ensuring all expenditure is compliant with University regulation and ensuring there is no overspend
- 11 Attending University events and social activities
- 12 Undertaking any other reasonable duties and responsibilities, commensurate with the post and grads as requested by the Head of Wellbeing, Therapeutic and Residential Life Services or member of the DSE Leadership Tam

This Job Description sets out current duties of the post that may vary from time to time without changing the general character of the post or the level of responsibility entailed.

Some occasional evening and weekend work will be required of the role holder
