The Department of Education, within the School of Education and Social Work, has been awarded a grant by eNurture for a short project exploring the digital worlds of unaccompanied refugee children and young people (URCYP), and investigating how their digital worlds link to their wellbeing. The research project is based on principles of co-production and is guided by three objectives:

- 1. Explore how URCYP experience and engage with the digital world to support their social integration and sense of belonging in the UK, and how this interplays with their transnational lives and connections.
- 2. Identify what URCYP perceive to be the risks to their safety and well-being from digital engagement and how they navigate these risks.
- 3. Co-design and co-produce a pilot project with URCYP which will embed new knowledge aimed at promoting positive mental health among UCRYP.



To support this work we are looking to appoint a part-time Research Fellow to work with Dr Linda Tip (University of Brighton) and a small team of peer researchers with lived experience of arriving in the UK as unaccompanied children. The Research Fellow will be responsible for training and supporting the peer researchers, codesigning an appropriate qualitative methodology and co-facilitating group activities. Depending on the interests of the URCYP we hope to engage in simple arts-based methods through which participants can build on perspectives whilst minimizing language barriers. The project will be guided by a small advisory group and the knowledge generated will be used to (i) inform the development of a short animation to support positive engagement of URCYP with digital resources; (ii) establish appropriate methodologies which could be used to apply for further research funding.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES

1. To engage in collaborative research activity, including taking a lead role in supporting researchers with lived experience, to co-design and co-produce research.



2. To co-facilitate arts-based focus groups and interviews with young unaccompanied refugee children and young people (URCYP), support data analysis and dissemination of findings.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

1.1 Role Specific duties

- 1.2 To support the training of young people with lived experience in qualitative methods (arts-based focus groups and interviews) and oversee the data collection process.
- 1.3 To work with the research team to co-design the research and to pilot an output which supports the positive engagement of URCYP with digital resources.
- 1.4 To ensure adherence to the highest ethical standards for the work, including confidentiality and informed consent.
- 1.5 To organise research data, manage transcription service and implement systems for secure data management for the project.
- 1.6 Analyse and interpret research findings in collaboration with the research team and draw conclusions on the outcomes.
- 1.7 To work with representatives from key stakeholder groups (e.g. Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children teams, Ethnic Minority Achievement Services, foster carers and NGOs working with URCYP) to establish an advisory group to oversee the project.
- 1.8 To participate as a full member of the research team
- 1.9 To provide general research support to the project as directed.
- 1.10 Through consultation with the research team, URCYP and our advisory group take a central role in establishing a strategy to disseminate our findings to URCYP and other stakeholders.

- 8. Ability to prioritise and meet deadlines.
- 9. Excellent IT skills.

- 1. Understanding of safeguarding risks and harms in young unaccompanied children and young people.
- 2. Commitment to social justice and the well-being of people who are seeking sanctuary in the UK.
- 3. Commitment to research approaches which valorise the knowledges and perspectives of marginalised groups.
