ABOUT LETTER IN THE ATTIC

During the course of 2007-8, the *Letter in the Attic* project is collecting personal papers, such as letters and diaries, from the people of Brighton and Hove. The aim of the project is to show the historical value and human insights offered by these often overlooked types of everyday writings. We're interested in material from any period of history - from centuries ago up until the present day. We have also begun to collect memoirs and everyday documents such as household bills and menus.

We're collecting these writing for an exhibition and a book. You don't need to part with the originals; we can scan and copy them. However, if you wish, we can arrange for your papers to be looked after by the East Sussex Records Office.

Many people think own letters and diaries aren't interesting - but they will be in 100 years time!
