Award of a non-accredited degree

Candidates will not normally be offered any further attempts at second re-sits or failed trailed resits.

Undergraduate awards

Failed modules trailed from the previous stage may be condoned at the award stage. A maximum of 30 credits may be granted via a combination of compensated and condoned credit in the final award stage.

Where BEng finalists are awarded a University of Sussex Honours degree as a result of being given condoned credits, the exit award will be named BSc (Hons) Engineering. This award will not be accredited by the PSBs. Where MEng finalists are awarded a Sussex Honours degree as a result of being given condoned credits, the exit award will be named MSci (Hons) Engineering. This award will not be accredited by the PSBs. In the case of MEng finalists, if they meet the requirements of a BEng award without requiring condoned credit, they will be given the option of taking this accredited award instead of the unaccredited MSci.

Any student affected by this regulation will be notified after the classification/MEng progression board, or after the equivalent resit board in September.

Postgraduate awards

The award of an MSc which includes up to 30 condoned credits will be a non-accredited degree. Any student affected by this regulation will be notified after the relevant exam board in March, July, or October.
