Notes: This is a rural household budget survey instigated by the government and covering the households of farmers and wage-earners (not artisans, tradespeople etc.). It began on 1 July 1959 and ended 30 June 1960.

Households from 50 districts were selected for representativeness and each asked to complete a budget book for one month (then extrapolated to annual figures). Those whose books were incomplete (3.8% of the sample) were interviewed to obtain sufficient information.

Data is presented in comprehensive group format, including information on food quantity and prices purchased, and that obtained by self-provisioning.
