Notes: There are, in fact, some budgets reaching back to 1890 in this report, but the majority are for 1912 and 1913. They are working class households with occupations recorded (such as metalworker, locksmith, miller). Income is recorded separately for 'husband', 'wife' and children, there being 12 items of income recorded altogether. Expenditure is relatively basic: there are only six items of household expenditure (food, clothing, housing, etc.). There is also a total outgoings recorded 'per quet'. There is some food data recorded for some families in tables throughout.

Notes: The households of this survey cover large cities (472 households), medium-sized cities/towns (279) and villages (107). The survey covers a majority of middleclass officials ('Beamten') but also some waged/workingclass households (183). From one published report of this survey, there are 17 items of expenditure, one of them being food. Food, however, is reported in further detail (24 items) as monetary and percentage shares of the total food spend in a contemporary review of the same survey. The same income groups are used, so the two reports match, providing a good coverage of food in detail together with other expenditures.

There is also a table with the distribution of occupation type (officials, salaried and waged plus unemployed). It only records expenditure on food and drink (26 items of expenditure). Many foods became scarce and so expensive in Germany during the war and these war-time surveys reflect this in the proportion of total income spent on food.

It is comprehensive, covering the following: location, occupational class and occupation, household composition with all ages specified; 8 items of income ('head of household', 'wife', etc.), 37 food & drink items, and 20 other items of expenditure such as rent, heating, clothing, etc. This survey is officially referred to as a budget of 2,000 households but the slightly lesser figure of 1,940 is exactly correct.
