Notes: A bibliographical entry in Williams & Zimmerman states that this study was 'written by a member of the Indian civil service who was anxious to vindicate the British Government of the charge that it had milked the province [of Faridpur] dry'. Although this alone might not be enough to render this survey questionable, Williams & Zimmerman further state that 'many of the figures must have been merely estimates'. Furthermore, there is no useable grouped (or individual) data to calculate inequality with income or expenses from household returns. Only averages are specified in the cases where results are divided between groups. But these groups are specified as 'In comfort', 'Below comfort', 'Above want/indigence' and 'In want/indigence'. We therefore note the existence of this study without using it.

**Notes:** This survey was conducted during the census of 1921 and covered a variety of household types in rural towns and villages. Householders' occupations included: 'small shop keepers, clerks, artisans, and the like, with a fair number of professional men and well-to-do landholders and moneylenders, and a fair number of labourers and domestic servants'. (Sedgwick, 1922, p. xcvi).

The original number of total budgets covered by this survey is 6,011 but the number with usable expenditure data is 5,915. The recording of expenditure data was rather rudimentary: with the aid of 'Honorary Correspondents' (unpaid volunteer interviewers) annual expenditures were estimated/recorded for a handful of (eight) expenditure categories.

The survey was conducted across the following five regions: Gujarat (1,387hh, 4 urban + 4 rural income groups), Komkan (728 households, 4 combined rural/urban income groups), Deccan (1,309, 4 urban + 4 rural income groups), Karnatak (1,320, 4 urban + 4 rural income groups), Sind (1,267, 4 urban + 4 rural income groups).

As stated on p. xcvi of Sedgwick (1922), this survey 'has nothing to do with the enquiry into Family Budgets of Workmen in Bombay conducted by the Labour Office. The existence of two separate enquiries of the same character at the same time is a pure accident'.

The budget for running this survey was minimal and 'while the Bombay enquiry collect[ed] and enter[ed] for any family the figures of actual expenditure in actual months in absolute detail, in the present enquiry the Honorary Correspondents were expected to make their own enquiries into detail and actual expenditure, and put the result down in the form of \_normal annual expenditure\_ under certain broad heads.'

153 Families of Cotton Mill workers in Sholapur proper and in the Criminal Tribes Settlement of Kalyanpur.

In regard to the 902 households, the report states that 'a rough and ready method of sampling had to be resorted to [...] The total number of persons supported by the industry was ascertained from the Census Report. This was divided by the average number of persons in each family [...] and thus the total number of families of cotton mill workers was roughly estimated [8,000-9,000]. It was then decided to collect about 1,000 budgets.' The weighting of Hindus to Muslims was, it seems, the main factor in weighting the samples then taken (p. 3).

Sampling of the 153 families was, arguably, even more questionable. The report states that 'It was not possible to follow any systematic plan of enquiry in the case of these families. Budgets were therefore collected from such families as were in a position to supply the necessary information and whose evidence the Lady Investigator considered trustworthy'.
