Notes: This survey is particularly concerned with nutrition, and with the methodology involved in working out nutritional content/caloric composition of foods. As such, Moquette positions himself alongside Dutch researchers such as G.J. Mulder and Haakma Tresling as well as the international research on nutrition by Attwater, Tigerstedt, Sonden, Klemperer et. al.

The survey took place in 1905 and twice surveyed the food intake of 10 male subjects [proefpersoon] who worked as labourers: once in the winter (Feb/March 1905) and again in the summer (July/August 1905) to assess their nutritional and caloric intake. Full details of the nutritional intake is given in the 'bijlagen' section starting on p. 183.

Moquette concludes that the labourers are not getting adequate nutrition: they average 2,538.4 calories a day where, he asserts, they should be getting 2,749.

Notes: This survey is concerned primarily with whether the cost of living for working households has changed significantly as a result of the war. It was felt that price inflation had potentially pushed households into poverty. The cost of living index had previously been based on the survey which had been carried out in 1912. In consequence, Van Zanten, the Director of the Bureau van Statistiek, commissioned this survey. The survey took place between 1 September 1918 and 31 August 1919, and comprised 82 households of 'officials' families and 32 of working families. The households of working families were surveyed from March 1919 and their results are reported monthly.

Notes: This is a detailed study by the town statistical bureau in The Hague intended to work out the cost of living and assess living standards in the town. It was carried out between 27 November 1920 and 25 November 1921 by method of household budget book. Families were paid 2 florins a week for taking part. It gives detailed group and individual level data, broken down into numbers and percentages. It also gives information on the composition (including ages of members) of each household.

The households are divided into 24 families where the main breadwinner is a worker, and 4 households where the main breadwinner is a manager.

Notes: This government enquiry began on 1 October 1923 with 270 households from a range of employment backgrounds; 33 managers; 80 state/civic bureaucratic employees; 21 civic workers; 114 workers in private businesses; 17 business managers and 5 teachers. It ended on 30 September 1924 with 212 households, whose results are presented here.

The government were seeking to assess the level of change in household living standards since the survey of 1918/19. The methodology was broadly similar. The two main differences were:

1. More of an effort was made to select households from different income groups;
2. The previous focus was mainly on expenditures to try to assess post-war conditions of living. In this survey, incomes were more relevant.

In the main table, all numbers are given to an equivalent adult male, to even out different sizes of household, and the units of consumption in each household are given.

Notes: This was a post-war continuous government survey of the households of artisan and manual workers in medium and small cities. Some, but not all of the households had children under the age of 16 living at home. The idea was to monitor the cost of living after the severe wartime shortages over several years in a series of surveys in different conurbations and among different sized samples.

Food prices were a particular concern for survey takers so there is extensive information on sub-categories of food consumption.

Data is given by three income groups in the first survey of January 1947, then subsequently four income groups in the rest of 1947 and 1948 and two income groups in 1949, and is presented by time periods of three months, so quarter years (i.e. January-April 1947, April-July 1947 etc.).
