Selection: Panama; only surveys with inequality measures.

1) Panama, 1952 - 1952 (Census Bureau and Paro)

Survey ID: 758

449 households

Sample Duration: 3 Month(s)

Notes: This survey in Panama City was undertaken by Pauline Paro, a U.N. consultant, in collaboration with the Panama Statistical and Census office. It was intended to form the basis of a new Consumer Price Index.

Data was obtained by interviewing families in 1953 about what they remembered of income and expenditures in the calendar year 1952. Working and middle-class households were selected from eight areas of the city. Data is for families that had an annual income up to B/13,000.

Data presented includes detailed grouped income and expenditure data including food expenditure, and information about how this data was converted into a CPI.

Relative to the 1942 and 1945 surveys, a sampling method was applied. The data obtained was used to establish a CPI.
