Selection: Trinidad and Tobago.

1) Trinidad and Tobago, 1943 - 1943 (Academic - Individual, C.C. Parisinos)

78 households

Sample Duration: 1 Year(s)

Notes: This survey was undertaken as a research project, and the data presented relate to the year 1 July 1942- 3 June 1943. Most of the families in this sample were of East Indian origin and Hindu religion. The families tended to divide their time between farming and other occupations.

Data presented is organised by size of farm, and includes detailed grouped income and expenditure data.

2) Trinidad and Tobago, 1943 - 1943 (Academic - Individual, A.L. Jolly)

Sample Duration: 1 Year(s)

Notes: A representative sample of this agricultural community was attempted. Most of the farmers worked the land only part-time, and had a variety of other occupations.

The article analyses the difference in income between rice, cane and provisions farming, in an attempt to provide recommendations for improving agricultural productivity. Jolly concludes by praising the industry of the East Indian farmers in the sample, and remarking how beneficial the system of farming with several families was for productivity.

3) **Trinidad and Tobago, 1944 - 1944 (Academic - Individual, A.L. Jolly)**

44 households

Sample Duration: 1 Year(s)

Notes: The survey was on the poor area of La Pastora, a recent land acquisition by the government. Racially, the sample of 44 households was divided relatively evenly between East Indian, West Indian and 'Spanish Indian' (mixed white/aboriginal) households, which reflected the diversity of the area.

The second part of the report on this survey focuses on the vegetable crops produced by many families in the area, and recommends that sole production of vegetable crops makes a poor living and is an inefficient use of the land.

4) **Trinidad and Tobago, 1944 - 1944 (Academic - Individual, A.L. Jolly)**

Sample Duration: 1 Year(s)

Notes: The survey was carried out on the population of Oropouche, which was exclusively East Indian in origin. Incomes in this areas were startlingly low, which Jolly attributes to the low prices in the 1920s and 1930s for the coffee and cacao crops which had been the main produce, leading farmers to diversify in more recent years. Land was not always fully utilised, in part due to change in function and in part to the lagoons.

Data presented is organised by size of farm. Income and some expenditure data is given , along with information on holdings.

Notes: A family expenditure survey conducted between December 1957 and June 1958 among a random sample of 1,056 households in Trinidad and Tobago. Expenditure patterns of households with an income up to \$ 200 per month for households of at least two persons, and up to \$ 150 per month for one person households.
