Terms of Reference

- To oversee the successful implementation and delivery of the <u>Student Voice Strategy</u>, and future strategic aims.
- b) To create a shared definition of student voice and promote a shared understanding of student voice institutionally, including through the mapping of student voice processes across the University and USSU and their respective aims/purpose. To ensure student voice is received in appropriate spaces for action and closing of feedback loops.

- c) To oversee the development of student voice policies and processes, receiving evaluations to determine their effectiveness, and ensuring a joined up approach between student voice processes institutionally. Such processes include, but are not limited to:
 - institutional student surveys (e.g. NSS, PTES)
 - module evaluations
 - student representative scheme
 - other student roles relating to student voice
 - student voice within governance structures
 - events related to student voice.
- d) To encourage evidence-based innovation and evaluation in student voice mechanisms, in particular to promote the voice of historically underrepresented student groups and international students.
- e) To oversee the development and evaluation of guidance, training, and communications to enable staff to engage, use and respond to student voice mechanisms and data effectively.
