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Introduction

This bibliography has been compiled to assist those researching corruption that takes place within the UK, as well as the involvement of UK institutions and organisations in corruption overseas. There is a much wider literature available on corruption in general and corruption in several other countries, and we have deliberately not attempted to incorporate those works within the list below, unless they have specific references or relevance to the UK. The most comprehensive bibliography available is the 'Bibliography on Corruption and Anticorruption' published by Professor Matthew C.
