Student Online Code of Conduct

Online etiquette

- 1. The same standards of behaviour are expected of students whilst in remote seminars/classes as would be expected in a real classroom.
- 2. You will need an appropriate space to attend seminars/classes from. You will need a desk and a chair within a quiet space as far as possible. You should not be wandering around. Using headphones or a headset with a microphone may be useful in reducing surrounding noise.
- 3. Dress appropriately, as you would if you were coming to a real classroom.
- 4. Do not eat during a seminar/class.
- 5. Do not use your mobile phone or social media, or listen to music or watch TV during a seminar/class.
- 6. Keep the microphone on mute unless you are in a breakout room or are invited by the tutor to speak.
- 7. Respect the privacy of tutors and other students. You should not record seminars/classes, take screen shots or post any element of the seminar/class online. This will be treated as a serious breach of the code of conduct.
- 8. Email the tutor to feedback any problems you may be experiencing with remote learning. You should not expect an immediate response, but tutors will try to get in touch as soon as they can.
- 9. The code of conduct also applies to individual meetings, e.g. Office Hours.
