The <u>South East Creative Economy Network</u> (SECEN) works to accelerate growth in the digital, creative and cultural sector. It is a working partnership between local authorities, creative businesses, arts and cultural organisations and education bodies (4 universities are members) across the <u>South East Local Enterprise Partnership</u> (SELEP) area which covers East Sussex, Kent and Essex.

SECEN identifies barriers to growth and implements practical and scalable initiatives to overcome them by aligning the efforts of businesses, education providers, strategic organisations and local authorities. Meetings enable sharing, good practice and opportunities to develop partnerships for future collaborations – and potentially accessing funds to support these.
