REF Open Access

REF OA FAQs published

The REF OA policy – what this means for authors

We have created a short guide for authors on achieving REF OA compliance, attached to this newsletter. The guide explains the requirements an article or conference proceeding must meet to be compliant with the REF OA policy and provides links to guidance material and further reading. Please feel free to share this with your colleagues as relevant, and let us know if any further information would be helpful for your Faculty/UoA etc.

REF Engagement and Impact policy deep dive

REF have announced an Engagement and Impact policy deep dive event on two full days over 5 to 6 June 2025. This is likely to cover topics including, but not limited to: the definition of engagement and its role in the assessment framework; the definition of rigour; the content and weighting of disciplinary statements; the number of case studies required in REF2029. Elements UoA Publications Dashboard

The Library have created a new publications dashboard report in Elements that allows users to filter publications by UoA group, based on the UoA groupings in the Assessment Module. [All Assessment Module managers can access the report here](#), or you can navigate to the Reporting Hub in Elements and search for 'UoA Publications Report'. Click the report title then the blue arrow icon in the top right corner and select your UoA from the dropdown menu at the bottom of the page before clicking the arrow in the top right to run the report. You can also filter by date range before running the report.

Faculty/RQI box folders

Ahead of each Faculty REF review day, we have set up Faculty-level RQI collaborative box folders, titled 'RQI and [Faculty name] Faculty folder'. We will use these folders to share documents that will be useful for all UoAs within a Faculty, for example, the notes from the Faculty REF review days. If you have not yet had your Faculty REF review day, your Faculty's folder will not be accessible yet.
