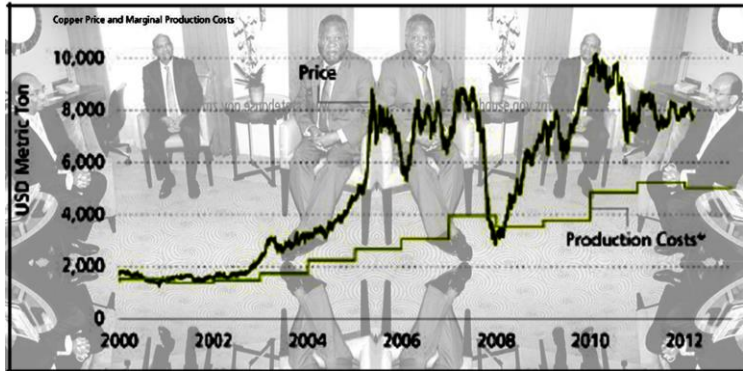

Official UK launch of Foil Vedanta's groundbreaking report*, which is currently shaking Zambia.

Following their visit to Zambia in December, the speakers report on tax evasion, environmental devastation, worker's rights abuses, and the interests behind copper mining companies - from financiers to the UK government (DfID), as well as the suppressive role of NGOs as 'parasites of the poor'.

The report published after their trip remains a top news item in Zambia today, and is changing the narrative of resource exploitation in Afrika created by corporate colonialism. Vedanta's executives are battling to cover up the evidence presented.

Vedanta is a British FTSE 250 company known as the 'world's most hated mining company' for their pattern of abuses and illegalities. It is 68% owned by billionaire Anil Agarwal.
