# Handbook for Visiting Doctoral Researchers 2019-20



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#### 1 INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1

The University of Sussex has long benefitted from a collaborative research environment in which doctoral mobility is key, and we welcome visits from Doctoral Researchers registered for an award elsewhere.

#### 1.2

The purpose of a visit to the University of Sussex, whether for a week or a year, is to enrich the Doctoral Researcher experience, to help Doctoral Researchers build a network of professional contacts in their field, and to provide temporary access to the world class facilities and supervision provided by the University.

#### 1.3

The purpose of this handbook is to provide guidance and relevant information to help you through the University's requirements for your research visit. It is intended to complement handbooks and other sources of advice that may be available to you at a more local level via your School and department.

## 1.4

Your main point of contact will be your supervisor or sponsor in one of our eleven academic Schools. Another useful source of information is the Research Student Administration Office (RSAO) in Sussex House.

# 2 KEY SOURCES OF SUPPORT FOR VISITING DOCTORAL RESEARCHERS

#### 2.1

Postgraduate education in the University of Sussex is largely organised within Schools and departments, the Doctoral School and the Research Student Administration Office. Responsibility for Doctoral Researchers within each School rests in the hands of a Director of Doctoral Studies (listed below).

#### 2.2

Most day-to-day contact will be at the local level and provided via your department or School. Your primary source of academic support will be your main research degree supervisor or academic sponsor. In addition, each School will have an administrator with overall responsibility for research degree students within that unit, the Research and Enterprise Co-ordinator (REC).

#### 2.3

The Research Student Administration Office publishes annually the Handbook and Regulations for Doctoral Researchers and the Handbook for Research Supervisors and Directors of Doctoral Studies. While these are primarily intended for Doctoral Researchers who are registered for their degree at Sussex, a visiting Doctoral Researcher may find that they contain useful information in addition to that contained here. 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# 4 TYPES OF RESEARCH STUDENT VISIT (SEE ALSO APPENDIX 1)

# 4.1 DOCTORAL RESEARCHER INFORMAL VISIT

Doctoral Researchers who wish to visit Sussex in order to attend a conference or seminar, to meet students and faculty, to observe specific methodological practice, and/or to plan a future collaboration or supervised visit, may visit for a maximum of two weeks. Such visits are to be arranged locally within the School and the Head of School is expected to maintain details of any such visits. The visitor would be insured to be in laboratories, but not to work independently. No formal application is required and no fee will be charged. Students who require a visa should apply for a Standard Visitor visa.

## 4.2 DOCTORAL RESEARCHER PLACEMENT

Doctoral Researchers who do not require any academic supervision but who wish to visit the University in order to independently use laboratory equipment or consult archives or other holdings, may visit for a maximum of three months. The fee for a Doctoral Researcher placement is £550 and visits may not be extended or repeated. The visitor would be insured to work independently under standard safety guidelines and practices. The application must be made via the online application system PG Apply. Where appropriate the Postgraduate Admissions Office will provide documentation to support your visa application.

# 4.3 DOCTORAL RESEARCHER SUPERVISED VISIT

Doctoral Researchers requiring academic supervision by a member of Sussex faculty may visit for a maximum of 12 months. Visits may not be extended or repeated. Doctoral Researchers will be charged the full tuition fee for the course based on the length of their visit. The level of supervision provided will be the same as a graduating Doctoral Researcher. The application must be made via the online application system PG Apply. Where appropriate the Postgraduate Admissions Office will provide the appropriate documentation to support your visa application.

# 4.4 DOCTORAL RESEARCHER SUPERVISED VISIT (UNDER PARTNERSHIP MOU)

Doctoral Researchers studying at a partner institution who require academic supervision by a member of Sussex faculty may visit for a maximum of 12 months. Visits may not be extended or repeated. Such visitors will not be charged a fee for their visit, and will receive the same level of academic supervision where a fee arrangement is explicitly agreed in the terms of the partnership, as a graduating Doctoral Researcher. The application must be made via the online application system PG Apply. The application must be made via the online application system PG Apply. Where appropriate the Postgraduate Admissions Office will provide the appropriate documentation to support your visa application. Please contact the Postgraduate Admissions Office if you are unsure whether a partnership MoU exists with your home University.

#### 5 APPLICATION

#### 5.1

An application for a Doctoral Researcher visit should be made via the online PG Apply system: www.sussex.ac.uk/study/apply

## 5.2

You should first contact a potential supervisor in the relevant School or department to make sure that they can accommodate your visit.

#### 6. REGISTRATION

#### 6.1

Registration is the formal process of recording the fact that you have become a member of the University. You will normally be sent information on how to register one month before the course start date. Once you have registered you will be able to use the Library, Computing and other facilities of the University.

#### 6.2

Your local address should be confirmed when you register, and any changes of address must be made by amending via Sussex Direct. This is important to ensure that we are able to keep in contact with you.



#### ' FEES

# 7.1

As part of online registration you will be required to pay your tuition or administration fee. (see appendix 1 for the 2019-20 fees).

#### 7.2

Failure to pay the fees will result in termination of your student registration and of the visit.

#### 8 SUPERVISION

#### 8.1

Throughout the period of any visit, the Doctoral Researcher's main supervisor at their home institution will remain responsible for the student's supervision and the overall direction of the research project.

# 8.2


Visiting Doctoral Researchers undertaking a Doctoral Researcher placement will be assigned an academic sponsor who will act as a local point of contact and will facilitate induction and training but will not provide formal supervision.

#### 8.3

For those visiting Doctoral Researchers undertaking a supervised visit, an academic supervisor will be appointed who will take responsibility for a significant portion of the scholarship and research direction of the thesis during the visit. At the end of the visit the Sussex supervisor will no longer be expected to provide input to the project.
