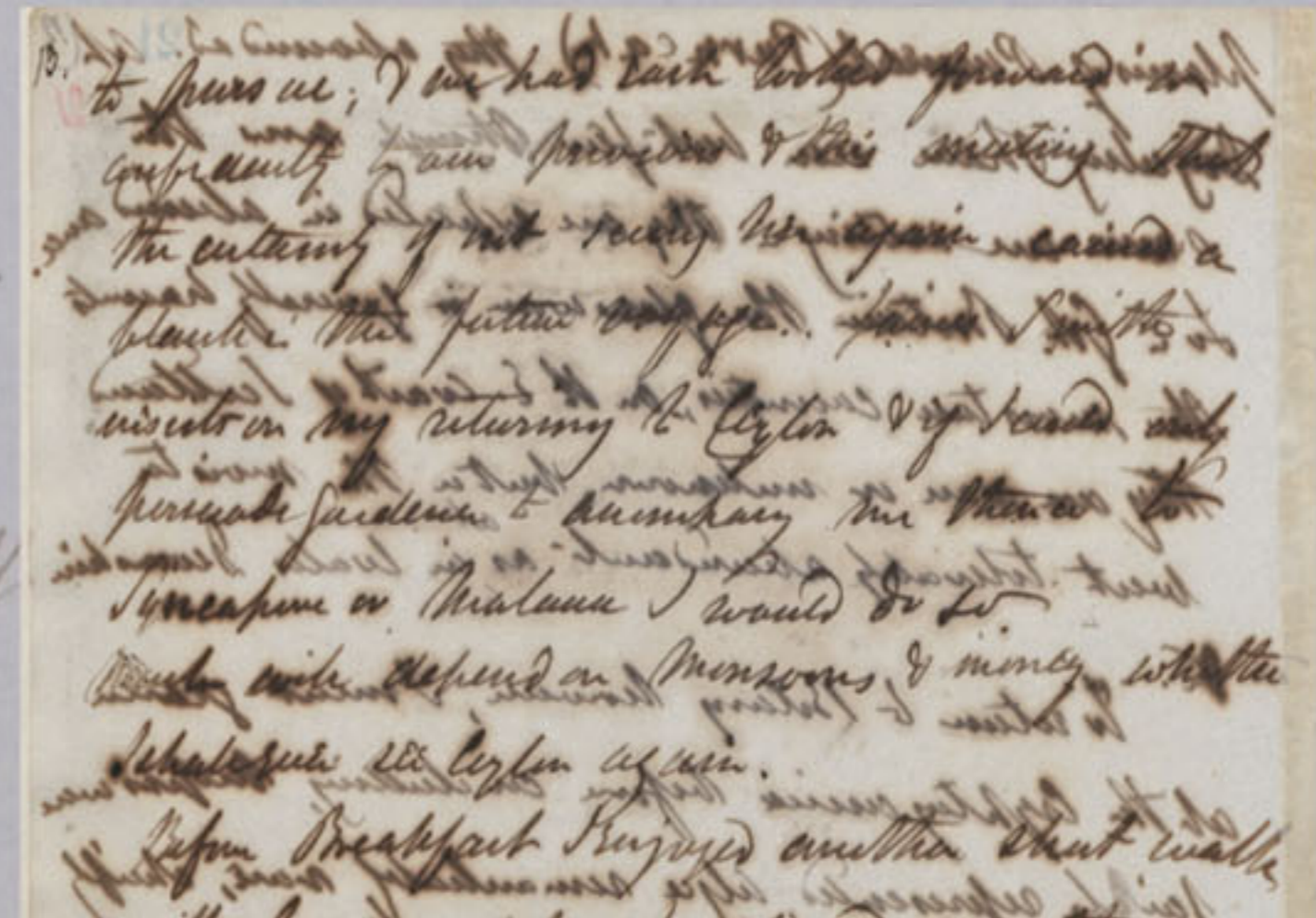
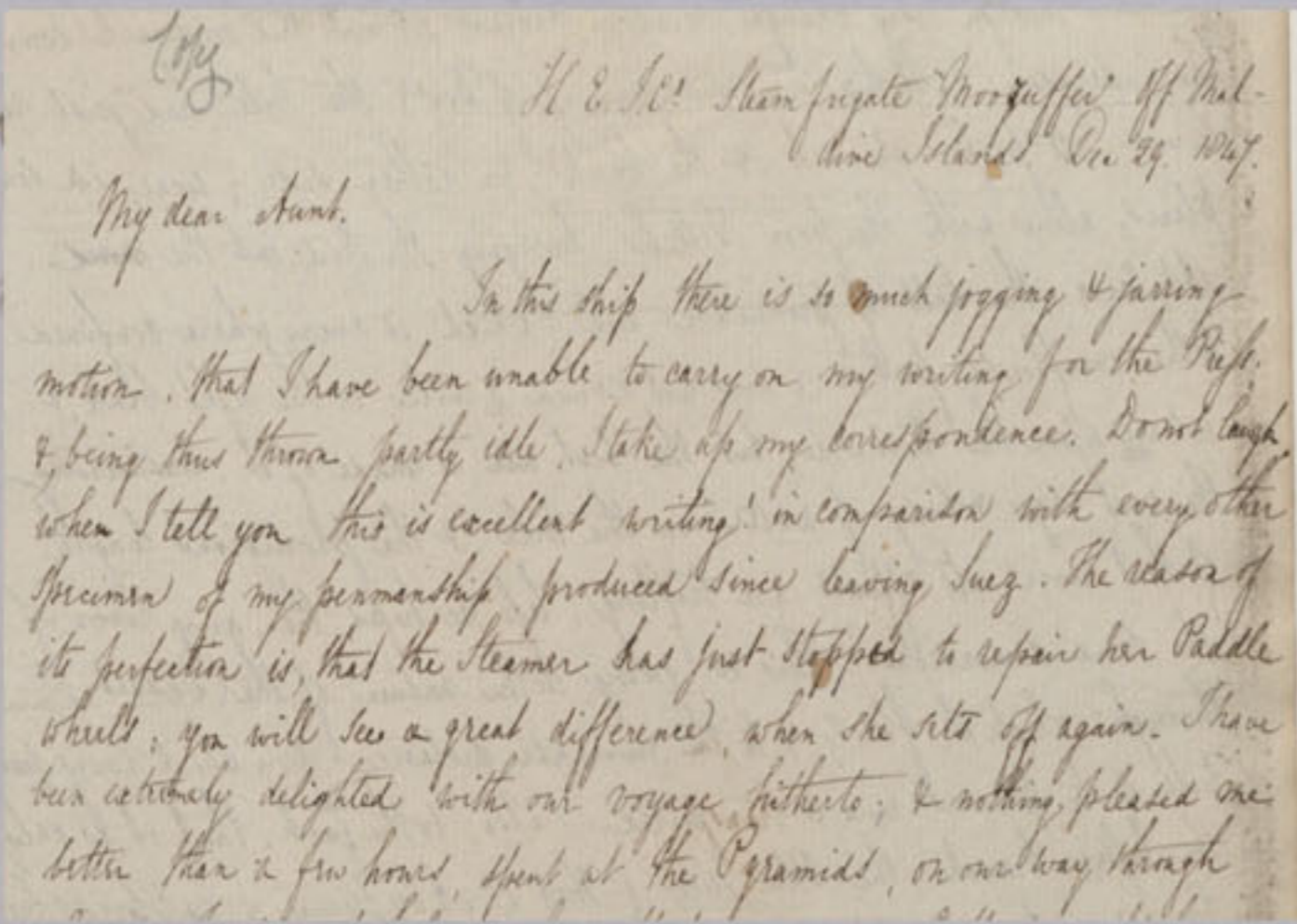
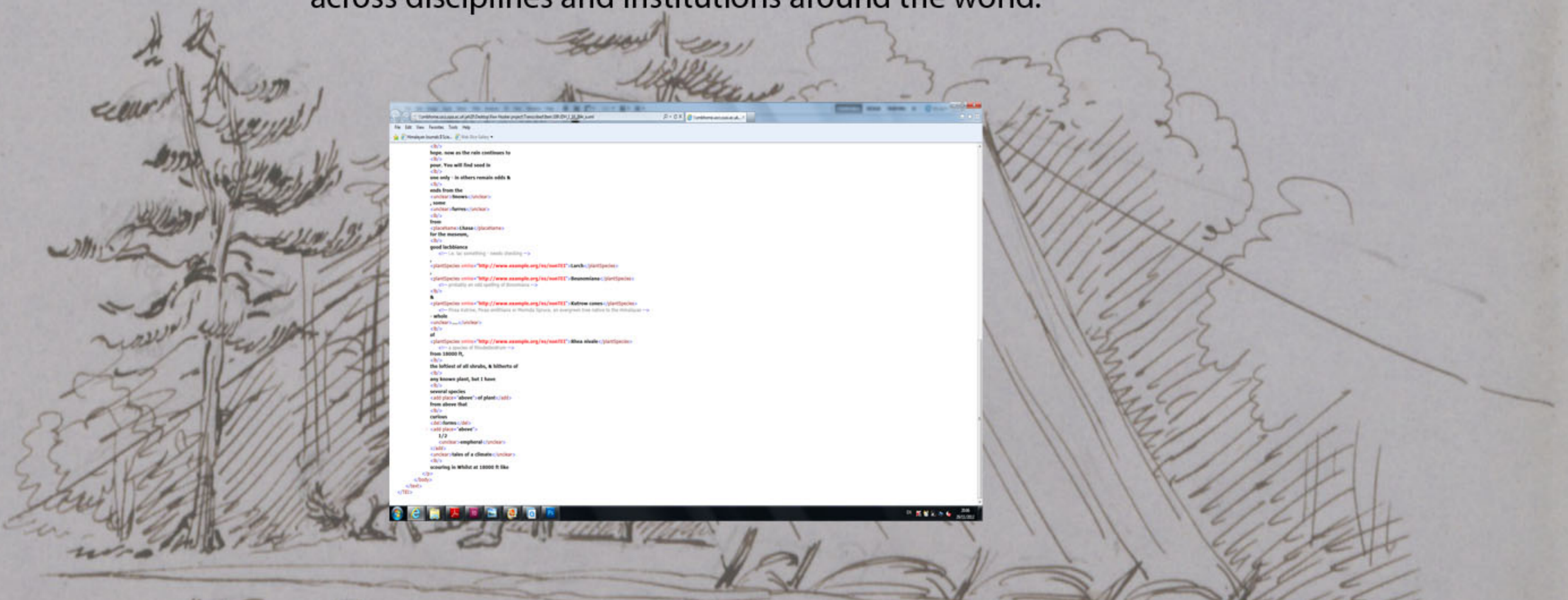


Joseph Hooker's India Letters

The project focuses on Joseph Dalton Hooker (1817–1911), in particular his correspondence with colleagues in India, including at the Kolkata botanical gardens. The transcription of the correspondence will complement several resources which are already in the public domain – including the Himalayan Journals (1854),+ the Introduction to the Flora Indica (1855) and the sections of Hooker's herbarium which have been digitised.
